1. Best practices in using technology, processes, or personnel to promote:
  - Knowledge creation, Knowledge maintenance
  - Storage of knowledge, Retrieving knowledge
  - A willingness to contribute to a knowledge repository and/or to seek knowledge from a knowledge repository
